In his commencement speech delivered at Standford University in 2005, Steve Jobs, the former CEO of the Apple Incorporation, put forward the idea of connecting the dots. As he said,

... you can't connect the dots looking forward; you can only connect them looking backwards. So you have to trust that the dots will somehow connect in your future. You have to trust in something—your gut, destiny, life, karma, whatever. This approach has never let me down, and it has made all the difference in my life.

Jobs attributed the creation of the first Macintosh computer topography to the calligraphy class he attended after he dropped out of college, a class he never thought of any practical application at the time but was purely fascinated by the beauty of topography. He also thought that he made a right decision in dropping out of college, for which he found no value then but had spent all of his adoptive parents' savings to pay the tuition fee.

- 1.
